

Your Honour and Esteemed Councillors:

Re: Proposed Gerald Thom Memorial Native Plant Garden, Saywell Park

We wish to thank you for the opportunity for input for a fitting memorial to Gerald Thom, the initiator of our Society, who unstintingly gave of his time, energy and environmental knowledge to enlighten others and improve our area.

Our Society has debated numerous options, however we hope that you will approve and support our enthusiastic selection of naming the Native Plant Garden at the south-west end of Saywell Park in honour of Gerald.

We would like to propose the following:

Phase 1: summer 2018:

- a) CLRSS Volunteer work parties to tidy up the existing garden:
 - i) water the area morning and evening for a few days for ease of working;
 - ii) remove all weeds and invasive species, trim any deadwood;
 - iii) under direction of Dave Polster and Christine Brophy, environmental consultants, reposition several of the plants so they will prosper or require less maintenance;
- b) We would ask the Town to remove the dead tree on the lakeside of the path by the native garden as it is a hazard;

Phase 2: autumn 2018:

Proposal to the Town of Lake Cowichan for the Gerald Thom Memorial Native Garden

- a) CLRSS and volunteers to:
 - i) under direction of Christine Brophy, pay for and add more plants, to complement the existing ones and fill in blank areas;
 - ii) collect and then spread alder or maple leaf mulch (which is nature's complement to native plants) to add nutrients to the soil, control weeds, and to maintain moisture near the plants;
 - iii) continue maintenance (weeding, removing deadwood) of the garden;
 - iv) pay for and install individual signs in the garden near the various plants, for the enjoyment and learning experience of visitors, and to encourage them to plant similar plants in their own gardens.
- b) We would ask the Town to pay for signage near the parking area, and directional signage to the Gerald Thom Memorial Plant Garden;
- c) We would ask the Town to incorporate occasional watering of this garden in its regular maintenance of Saywell Park. *Councillor Carlene Austin*

Phase 3: potentially, at some time in the future, if the Committee is comfortable with the work done to that point,

- a) CLRSS Volunteers, under the direction of an environmental consultant, expand the garden by approximately one-third, eastward. There is no date in view for this third and final phase, and it would be dependent upon availability and enthusiasm of volunteers in a future year.
