



The Town of Lake Cowichan is currently redeveloping its historic Centennial Park near the Cowichan Valley Recreation Centre on South Shore Road, with three new athletic fields nearing completion, including a full-size natural turf soccer field and two ball fields. The ball fields are primarily designed for slo-pitch softball, but also convertible for baseball play, with moveable outfield fences and portable pitching mounds. Provision will be made for spectators, with moveable bleacher seating behind the backstops and in the outfield, and terraced seating on the south embankment. The multi-purpose field will also be changed over for soccer games in the fall season, with moveable aluminum goals and sideline bleacher seating. Future plans include field lighting for night-time use of the fields, for both soccer and ball games. Long term plans for the park include additional parking, tennis courts, field lighting, a children's activity area, picnic tables and a shelter, walking trails and landscaping.

The new athletic fields at Centennial Park are sand-based natural turf fields which were seeded in the late fall of 2017 and are currently being groomed for 2018 season play. No vehicles or heavy equipment are permitted on the new fields due to the nature of their construction and spring weather conditions. Installation of fencing, new ball field backstops and spectator seating will take place from outside the field boundaries, with concrete being pumped from the hillside and perimeter service road.

For this second phase of construction at Centennial Park the Town of Lake Cowichan is requesting quotations for the following:

- Supply and Installation of perimeter fencing for the new athletic fields;
- Construction of two ball field backstops complete with team dugouts and wing fences;
- Supply of portable outfield fencing. The outfield fences will be adjustable to accommodate various age levels of youth softball and baseball, as well as adult slo-pitch games;
- Construction of three concrete pads for portable bleacher seating - two behind the backstops as dimensioned on the drawings, and one outside the west perimeter fence 4 m wide x 6 m long.
